- Prior to 1819 Methodists in the area worshiped in a log house on the property of Joseph Brabham, Sr.
- In 1819 Baptists and Methodists alternated worship at Kirkland school house,
- In 1826 the two groups built Philadelphia Meeting House to be used as a union church.
- In 1832 Mizpah Church was built on a lot given by Robert C. Kirkland, a mile or so from Philadelphia.
- In 1856, two miles west of the 1832 structure, present Mizpah Church was built at Buford's Bridge.
- The only church ever built in Buford's Bridge, it is the remaining vestige of the town burned by Federal troops in 1865.



Storm Water Control and Landscape Enhancement Plans



Background and Progress Report Spring 2013

Background:

The Church Building and Cemetery of Mizpah UMC reside on a natural slope running from North to South. The elevation difference from the Picnic Shelter to the lower corner of the southeast fence is approximately ll feet. During rain events, water continues to wash towards the back of the Church and through the cemetery despite some efforts to eliminate this problem. As well, storm water continues to erode the church access road named Mizpah Lane as it turns towards the southern entrance on Rivers Bridge Road. This water control problem has been an ongoing concern of the Trustees as water damage under the Church structure was the primary reason the church required extensive renovation in the recent past.

In order to obtain a professional opinion, the Bamberg office of the Natural Resource Conservation Service, USDA (formerly Soil Conservation Service) was asked for assistance to develop a plan to remediate the storm water problems associated with the site at Mizpah. Due to Mizpah's listing on the National Historic Register, their consultation, surveying, engineering, and plan development services have to date been free of charge. Three possible water control recommendations were presented and the current plan has been deemed the most desirable by the Trustees and NRCS officials. It should be emphasized that the NRCS required, and has determined, that the current proposal does not in any way disturb the historic attributes of the Mizpah site. In other words, great care has been taken to ensure that no historical structures, artifacts or significant visual aesthetics will be affected by the landscape project.


Progress Report:

It has been determined that the most natural flow of the water from the northern portion of the

church property to the south should be alongside the eastern cemetery fence boundary. The proposal recommends placing a diversion mound or water bar between the picnic shelter or new bathroom building and the cemetery fence. This mound will slope towards the east and divert storm water towards Mizpah Lane which will be reconfigured into a grassed waterway dedicated to storm water diversion. The outflow of the water will then disperse into the woods south of the Church grounds. Once stabilized, the grassed waterway would still be available for parking alongside the fence.

To dedicate the existing dirt road to a waterway and still have a lane available for access from the south, it was suggested that Mizpah Lane be moved to the east by at least 30 feet onto higher ground. However, this would encroach upon the lands of Kearse Family Partnership. Mrs. Beverly Kearse Rowland, the general manager of the Partnership, met with USDA officials and Mizpah Trustees at which time she agreed to deed over to Mizpah the additional footage necessary for the new road as well as enough additional acreage to allow Mizpah to maintain an aesthetic border beside the road.


In order to establish the current property lines and have a legal reference for the lands to be deeded to Mizpah, a new survey of the Church grounds has been completed and corners established. Kearse Family Partnership will then deed over to Mizpah the additional acreage necessary for the improvements. In conjunction with this project, Kearse Family Partnership will harvest the timber around Mizpah and Ebenezer Churches due to under-stocking and the general poor health of the trees on these lands. The Partnership will then create permanent fire breaks around both churches and will establish a new Longleaf Pine forest that will be more resilient over time to drought than the current Water Oak and Loblolly Pine dominated forest.



Once the trees are harvested, the new road site will be cleared and graded. After the new Mizpah Lane is established, then the old lane and other water control features will be constructed according to the engineering specifications as outlined by the Natural Resource Conservation Service.

In addition, a row of Live Oaks will be planted along the eastern side of the new road to create a visually appealing entrance for the long-term. Some additional vegetative landscaping will be done around the southern entrance as well as part of the project.

All of this activity will drastically change the appearance of the eastern side of the church grounds for several years until the new Longleaf forest and Live Oak plantings become established. However, some of the older family members will recall that this now forested area was once an open field as recently as the late 1950's, so landscape change is not new to the lands around Mizpah UMC. Fortunately in this case, the changes occurring should have a very positive outcome for preserving the grounds and the Church building of Mizpah by controlling soil erosion as well as water seepage under the Church. The Trustees ask for your understanding in hopes that these efforts will provide a long-term benefit for the future generations that cherish the Mizpah United Methodist Church heritage.


Graduations, Honors and Other News:
